he Celts first arrived in Ireland around 500 BC asserting themselves as the dominant ethnic group in Ireland. While in Belfast we will take a day trip to Antrim - known for its stunning coastline and beautiful countryside used for many filming locations for the HBO series *Game of Thrones*. Belfast is also the birthplace of the famed Titanic, which was constructed on Queen's Island (now known as the Titanic Quarter). For our last night in Belfast we will visit The **Titanic Experience**, a collection of immersive exhibits that tell the story of Titanic from her majestic beginning to her tragic end. The museum is located on the same shipyard where Titanic was constructed, and where she was launched in 1912.
